**HeppSY Mobile Classroom visit to Outwood Academy Adwick  
on the 22<sup>nd</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> February 2018.**

The HeppSY Project is an exciting new project that is part of the National Collaborative Outreach Programme with an aim to increase the number of young people progressing to Higher Education. As part of the project, we have invited the HeppSY Mobile Classroom (HeppSY Bus) to visit Outwood Academy Adwick on the 22<sup>nd</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> February 2018.

**What is the HeppSY Mobile Classroom?**

Education chiefs from the Higher Education Progression Partnership South Yorkshire (HeppSY+) have launched a mobile classroom (the HeppSY bus) with Chris Stead, Senior Activity Officer, National Collaborative Outreach Programme (NCOP) and a number of Graduate Interns from Sheffield Hallam University.

The team are touring the region giving talks and workshops on board the double-decker bus to students from 38 secondary schools and colleges.

On both days, the bus will be parked in the academy staff car park and will remain there throughout the academy day. Students from Years 9, 10, 12 and 13 will be invited to take part in sessions on the bus throughout Periods 1 to 5.

The sessions will cover two themes and will be adapted appropriately for each year group:

**Career Knowledge** - Employment Pathways, Graduate Prospects.

**Higher Education Knowledge** - The benefits of Higher Education, student finance, UCAS information.

The sessions will promote the benefits of Higher Education to our Year 9 and 10 students and will support our Sixth Form students in their transition to Higher Education. We hope the students find them extremely useful for making decisions about their future.
